The Redondo Beach Police Department will be hosting the 2010 Annual Public Safety Fair on Sunday October 3, 2010, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Redondo Beach Civic Center, located at 401/415 Diamond Street. The event kicks off Fire Prevention Week and Crime Prevention Month. This year's Safety Fair will offer the following fun and informative activities.

- Enjoy demonstrations by our nationally recognized K9 team, Traffic Motorcycle Enforcement Unit, Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team, Redondo Beach Fire Department, and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT).
- Take a "Just Visiting" Jail and Station tour.
- Test your judgment in shoot/don't shoot scenarios with our Firearms Training Simulator (FATS).
- Try walking a straight line while wearing "beer goggles".
- Ride your bike to the event and park it for free in the secure "Bike Valet." While parking your bike take advantage of the free bike registration, saving you four dollars.
- Learn about the history of the Redondo Beach Police Department from Amador Espinosa, a fifty-six year employee and official Police Department Historian.
- Explore and sit in a Police Car, on an All Terrain Vehicle (Quad) or the Assault Rescue Vehicle (ARV). Bring your camera to capture the back seat moment.
- Enjoy free hot dogs grilled by the Police Reserves while jamming to live music.
- Redondo Beach Recreation and Community Services staff will monitor a fenced-in children's playground with a bounce house, face painting and crafts.

New this year is a Kid's Bike Safety Challenge. Presented by the RBPB bike team officers the Bike Challenge will discuss safe biking habits, offer bike demonstrations and a challenging course for the kids to ride while practicing safe biking habits. The bike challenge is designed for ages five to fifteen years. Parents please bring your child's bike and helmet to the event.
