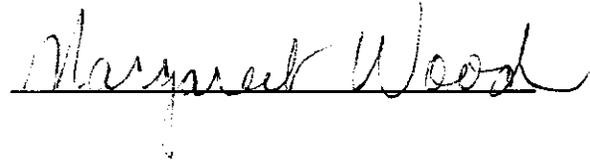

H1. Perry Park and La Paz Parkette Playground Renovation Projects Update

Administrative Analyst Paula Matusa gave a report and reviewed the following:

- Commission received presentation in January 2012 with the conceptual plans
- New play equipment and surfacing for both parks
- General improvements to enhance access, safety and aesthetics
- La Paz construction began in late March 2012
- Perry Park construction began in early April 2012
- Play equipment installed in Perry Park and in use
- Play equipment installed in La Paz but additional park improvements are in process – park to open the end of May 2012
- Improvements will be done to the Perry Park basketball courts to be completed by the end of May 2012
- Budget on Perry Park is \$209,000
- Budget on La Paz Parkette is \$135,000
- Before and after pictures at both parks and play equipment
- Recommendation – receive and file an update on the Perry Park and La Paz Parkette Playground Renovation Projects

In response to Commissioner Michael, Administrative Analyst Matusa stated for La Paz Parkette, entry to the park and access to the play equipment will be ADA accessible. For Perry Park, the entrance to the park is already ADA accessible and rubber surfacing was installed at the swings to allow for wheelchair access.

Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated staff will send an invitation to the Commission on information for the grand opening.

Motion by Commissioner Buchan, seconded by Commissioner Lewis, to receive and file an update on the Perry Park and La Paz Parkette Playground Renovation Projects. Motion carried unanimously, with Commissioners Brunkhardt and Knight absent.

H2. Seaside Lagoon Restroom Rehabilitation Project

Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen provided a brief status report and overview of the project as follows:

- Photos of the existing entry building and restrooms currently at Seaside Lagoon – in need of renovation
- Construction began in February 2012
- \$1.2 million project funded through Tideland contributions
- Photos of the new project and final completion
 - Work still needs to be done on the exterior
 - Most of the interior work has been completed
 - Roof has been replaced
 - Toilets and facilities added
 - Completion at the latest is June 7 but should be closer to the opening on Memorial Day
 - Back up plan is to have portable restrooms in the parking lot

In response to Chair Boston, Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated the showers and restrooms are in the major building and there are no changes to the lanai area which will be a future year project.

Motion by Commissioner Buchan, seconded by Commissioner Michael, to receive and file a report regarding the Seaside Lagoon restroom rehabilitation project. Motion carried unanimously, with Commissioners Brunkhardt and Knight absent.

COMMISSIONER REFERRALS TO STAFF

Commissioner Lewis noted a handrail below the Historical Library which has had a caution ribbon around it for the past six months and requested that it get repaired by summer. She also noted erosions and sharp rocks on the surface throughout the dog park and requested a layer of sand to help buffer it.

Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated staff is waiting to hear back from Edison regarding acceptable materials for the dog park. He also said he will followup with Public Works, and he will provide an item on the Commission's next agenda on this matter.

In response to Commissioner Michael, Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated the current surface is sand and dirt at the dog park.

Commissioner Geittmann noted trash overflowing the trash bins on holidays at Veteran's Park and suggested the contractor provide extra bins during the holidays.

Commissioner Buchan noted a structure on a beach for kids to play on and asked if this would be allowed on our beaches.

Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated the beach is under the jurisdiction of the county and anything installed would need their permission. He also

said Coastal Commission regulations would need to be met as well. He indicated he could bring this issue up at one of the quarterly meetings with the county regarding the process.

In response to Chair Boston, Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated there is continuing monitoring and testing obligations at the Seaside Lagoon along with reports being provided to the Regional Water Quality Control Board.

In response to Commissioner Michael, Recreation and Community Services Joe Hoefgen stated maintenance and repairs for parks comes out of the Public Works budget.

Subject: PERFORMING ARTS CENTER UPDATE

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file a report updating the status and activities of the Redondo Beach Performing Arts Center.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For a number of years, the ongoing operational goal of the Center has been to decrease the level of General Fund support while simultaneously increasing the quantity, quality and diversity of cultural offerings. Following the City Council's approval of a Business Plan in 2006, the General Fund subsidy for the Center has steadily decreased and the program offerings have significantly expanded. Specifically, the FY 2011-12 subsidy projection has been reduced to \$256,295 annually, which is a 55% reduction as compared to the \$572,005 General Fund subsidy provided to the RBPAC in 2006. Broadway quality musical theater is returning to the RBPAC with the new addition of 3-D Theatricals. They presented their first musical at the RBPAC, *Avenue Q*, in August 2012, receiving a strong audience and sales response, and have two weeks rented at the RBPAC for additional productions.

BACKGROUND

The Redondo Beach Performing Arts Center (RBPAC) is a highly sought after, fully inclusive, community service facility in the City of Redondo Beach. The Center continues to expand its reputation as the preferred South Bay regional destination for a significant variety of socially and economically diverse rental clients. It hosts over 500,000 patrons and artists each year and has become a vital component of the City's cultural and visitor serving brand.

For a number of years, the ongoing operational goal of the Center has been to decrease the level of General Fund support while simultaneously increasing the quantity, quality and diversity of cultural offerings. Following the City Council's approval of the Operating Plan in 2006, the General Fund subsidy for the Center has steadily decreased and the program offerings have significantly expanded. Specifically, the FY 2011-12 subsidy

projection has been reduced to \$256,295 annually, which is a 55% reduction as compared to the \$572,005 General Fund subsidy provided to the RBPAC in 2006. A six year history of the RBPAC financials is provided in the attached materials.

New RBPAC initiatives include packaging entertainment events with related Redondo Beach businesses, expanding film and television production events, and recruitment and retention of qualified, part-time theater professionals to adequately support the expanding event programming.

The Center's programming is generated by resident organizations; local, national and international promoters; community-based organizations; and various media, television and film companies. Recent high profile programming successes include The U.S. Martial Arts Festival, Free The Slaves Freedom Awards, Ovation Awards, Miss & Mrs. Asia USA Pageant, Debbie Allen Dance, Power of Art Festival, and filming of television shows America's Got Talent and Glee. A detailed listing of the Center's current cultural programming can be found in the Events Calendar on the RBPAC website at www.RBPAC.com. Supplemental information covering RBPAC programming is attached to this report.

The Center's current resident clients are the Los Angeles Ballet, the Distinguished Speakers Series, and Kala Koa Entertainment. Additionally, staff has confirmed a new rental client to present Broadway quality musical theatre at the RBPAC. 3-D Theatricals, currently based in Fullerton, CA, has presented the acclaimed musical comedy *Avenue Q* to encouragingly large audiences, and will continue with two additional musical productions at the RBPAC in 2012. Irving Berlin's *I Love a Piano* will play September 28-30, 2012; and *Hairspray* will play November 2-4, 2012. Planning is underway to present five 3-D Theatrical productions at the RBPAC in 2013, and further, a potential permanent relocation to the Center to become the new resident musical theater company in 2014.

As a final note, staff has incorporated the RBPAC as a designated staging area and civilian shelter in the Redondo Beach emergency response plan.

The General Fund subsidy is at its lowest point in the history of the RBPAC as shown below and in the attached six year history of revenues versus expenditures.

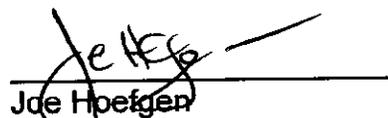
FY 2011-12 Projected Revenue

Supplemental Information on RBPAC Programming

Amongst the regular programming at the RBPAC since 1992 were musical theater productions by The Civic Light Opera of South Bay Cities (CLOSBC). The City provided resident client support to the CLOSBC by offering first right of refusal for booking date reservations, exclusive marketing and public relations placements at the RBPAC, and rental rates that were below market standard. In 2010-11 the CLOSBC presented four theatrical productions at the RBPAC. The CLOSBC rentals were comprised of four five-week periods during a span from September 4, 2010, through May 9, 2011. The rental charges for use of the RBPAC for the four productions totaled \$219,322.50. The CLOSBC made payments to the City totaling \$10,000., leaving an overdue balance of \$209,322.50 owed to the City for 123 days covering 76 theatrical performances which occurred in 2010 and 2011. No additional payments from the CLOSBC have been received by the City as of this report.

In August, 2011, the City reopened dates in September, October, November and December, 2011, as well as in February, March, April and May, 2012, which had been held as per the request of the CLOSBC for their exclusive use as of July, 2011. These reopened periods allowed staff the flexibility to attract newfound rental clients, as well as to offer expanded programming to the Center's existing clients. Staff conducted widespread public relations to notify numerous industries of the newly available dates at the Center. Additionally, staff contacted all recent and current rental clients, informing them of the newly available dates at the Center. The RBPAC has successfully booked 47 of these available dates in FY 2011-12.

The rental events that have occurred or are scheduled to perform at the Center in 2011-12 during the newly reopened dates include:

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file a report related to the preparation of a master plan for the various uses at Veterans Park.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Veterans Park is a 6.3-acre park located at the Esplanade and Torrance Boulevard. This highly popular park includes a number of different uses including large grassy area, playground equipment, various picnic tables and benches, the Veterans Memorial, the Veterans Park Community Center, and the Veterans Park Senior Center.

Over the course of the next few months, staff will be drafting a Veterans Park "master plan" to integrate the various uses which take place at Veterans Park. This work will be completed with input from the various departments of the City, with the Department of Recreation, Transit and Community Services taking the lead.

The purpose of this administrative report is to advise the Recreation and Parks Commission that preparation of this plan is underway, and to solicit any feedback and observations concerning the uses at Veterans Park that Commissioners and members of the public may be willing to share with City staff at this time.

BACKGROUND

Veterans Park is a 6.3-acre park at the Esplanade and Torrance Boulevard. This highly popular park includes a number of different uses including large grassy area, playground equipment, various picnic tables and benches, the Veterans Memorial, the

Veterans Park Community Center, and the Veterans Park Senior Center. Additional information related to the Community Center and the Senior Center is provided below:

The **Veterans Park Community Center** is a 13,333 square foot historic building (formerly Redondo Beach Main Library) constructed in 1930, and listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Center contains a grand ballroom/banquet room, mezzanine, meeting rooms, fully equipped catering kitchen, office, bridal room, restrooms, elevator and storage. The building is leased to Spectrum Catering for weddings, banquets, meetings and special events.

The **Veterans Park Senior Center** is a 4,172 square foot facility which includes a main activity/dining room, secondary activity room, kitchen, lobby, restrooms, storage areas, and outdoor patio and shuffleboard courts. The Center is used approximately 45 hours per week for senior activities.

As referenced earlier, over the course of the next few months, staff will be drafting a Veterans Park "master plan" to integrate the various uses of Veterans Park. This work will be completed with input from the various departments of the City, with the Department of Recreation, Transit and Community Services taking the lead.

The intent of the master plan is to identify ways to better integrate the various uses of Veterans Park and to plan for the eventual construction of the Events Plaza at the site of the former bandshell. Through the master planning process, it is envisioned that recommendations will be made concerning:

- The existing and future landscaping at Veteran's Park;
- Replacement of the existing playground equipment;
- The location of walkways;
- Replacement park furnishings and trash cans;
- How to best integrate the Events Plaza into Veterans Park including managing its use and operation;
- Park entrance improvements;
- Other improvements to enhance Veterans Park;

All current uses at the Park are envisioned to remain.

The master plan will be developed over the course of the summer months and brought back to the Recreation and Parks Commission for additional input before the report is finalized.

The purpose of this administrative report is to advise the Recreation and Parks Commission that preparation of this plan is underway, and to solicit any feedback and

observations concerning the uses at Veterans Park that Commissioners and members of the public may be willing to share with City staff at this time.

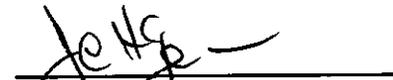

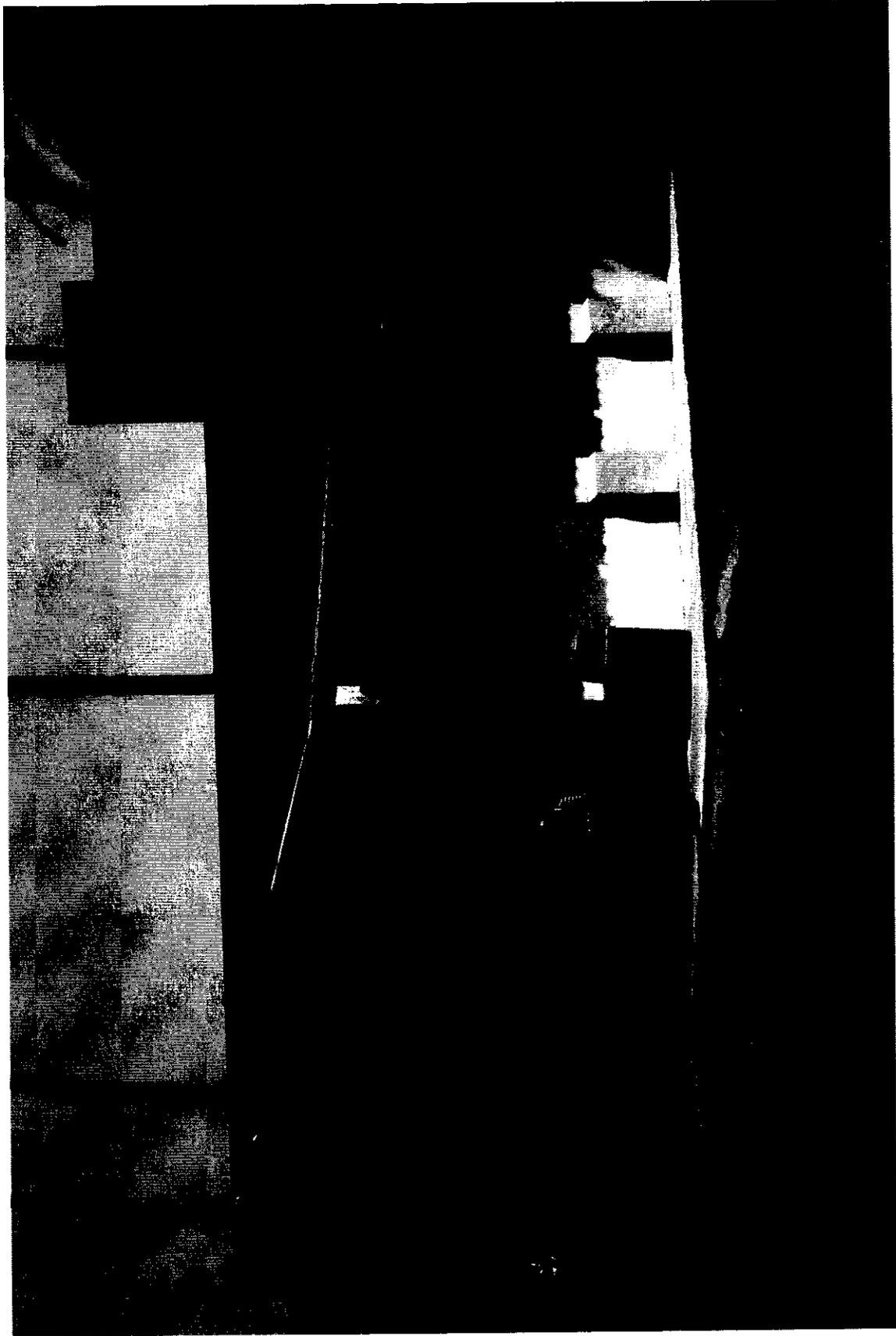

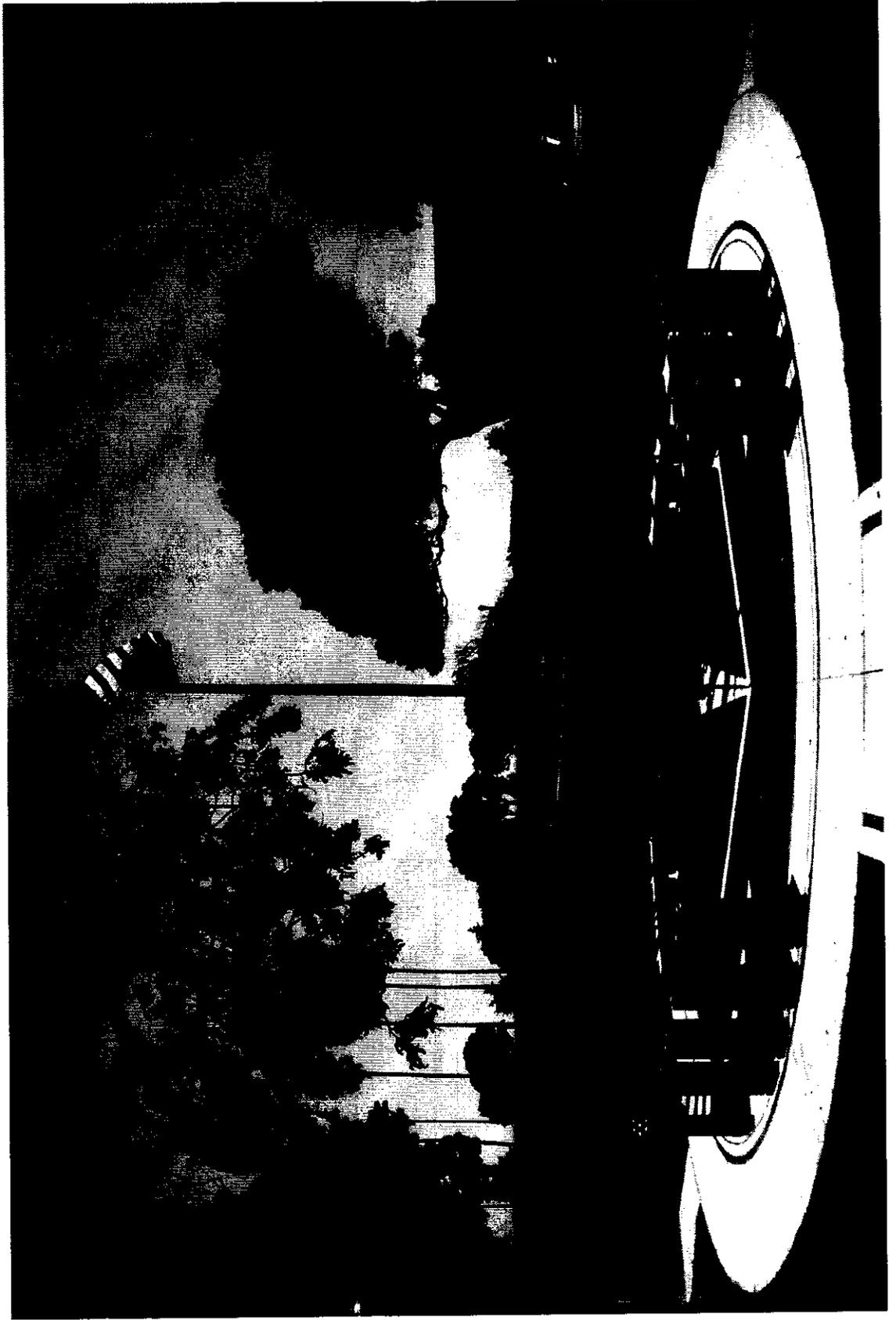

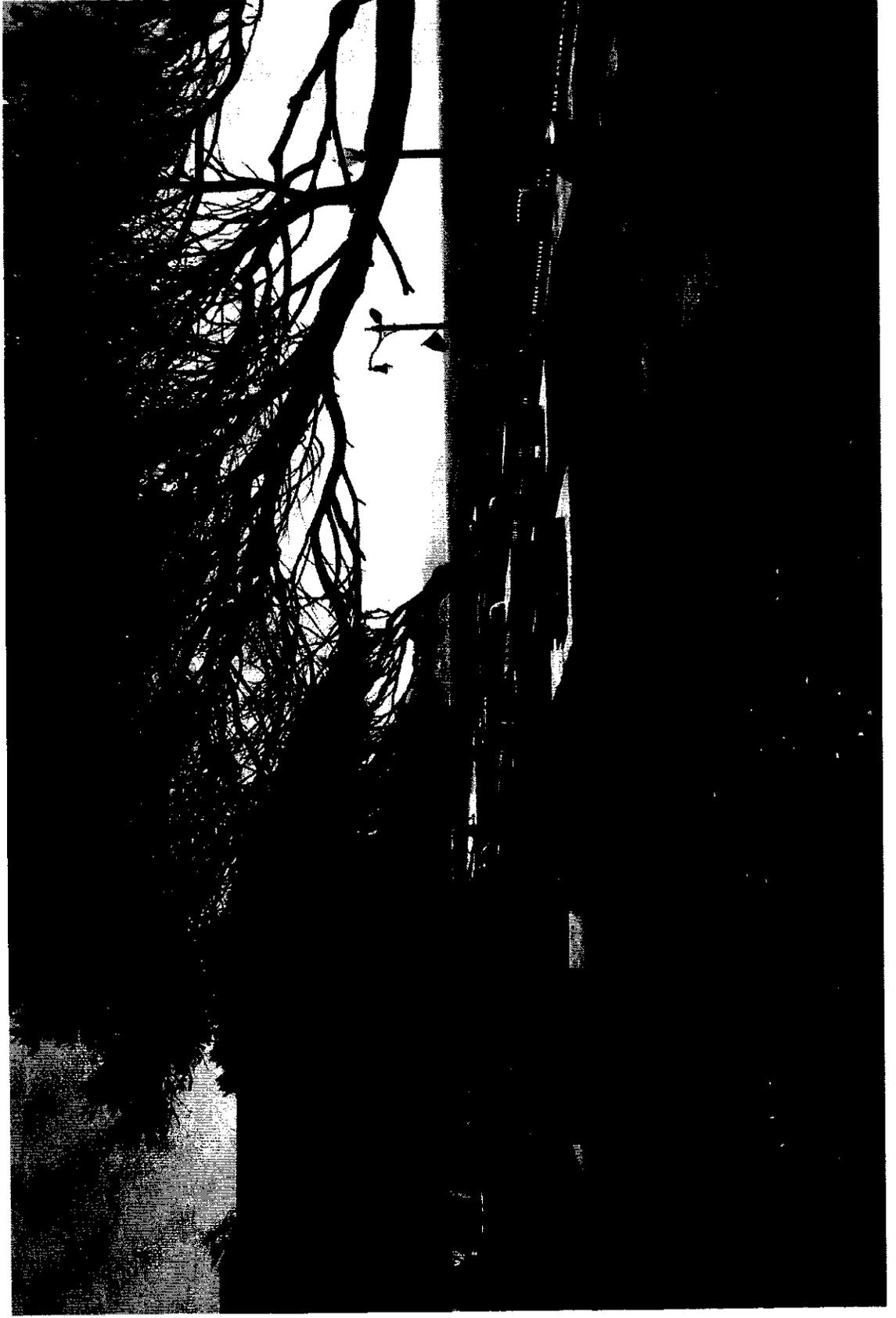

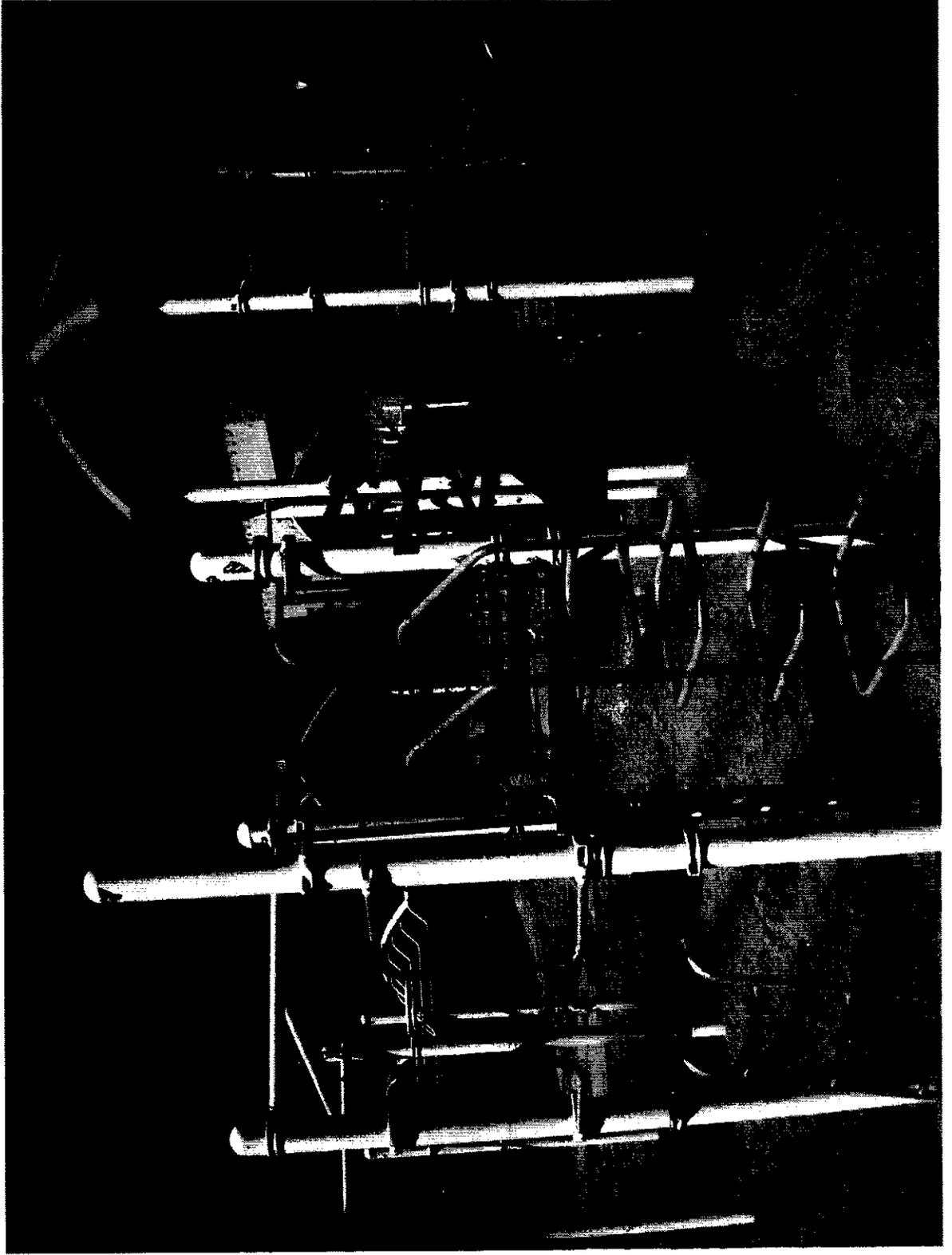

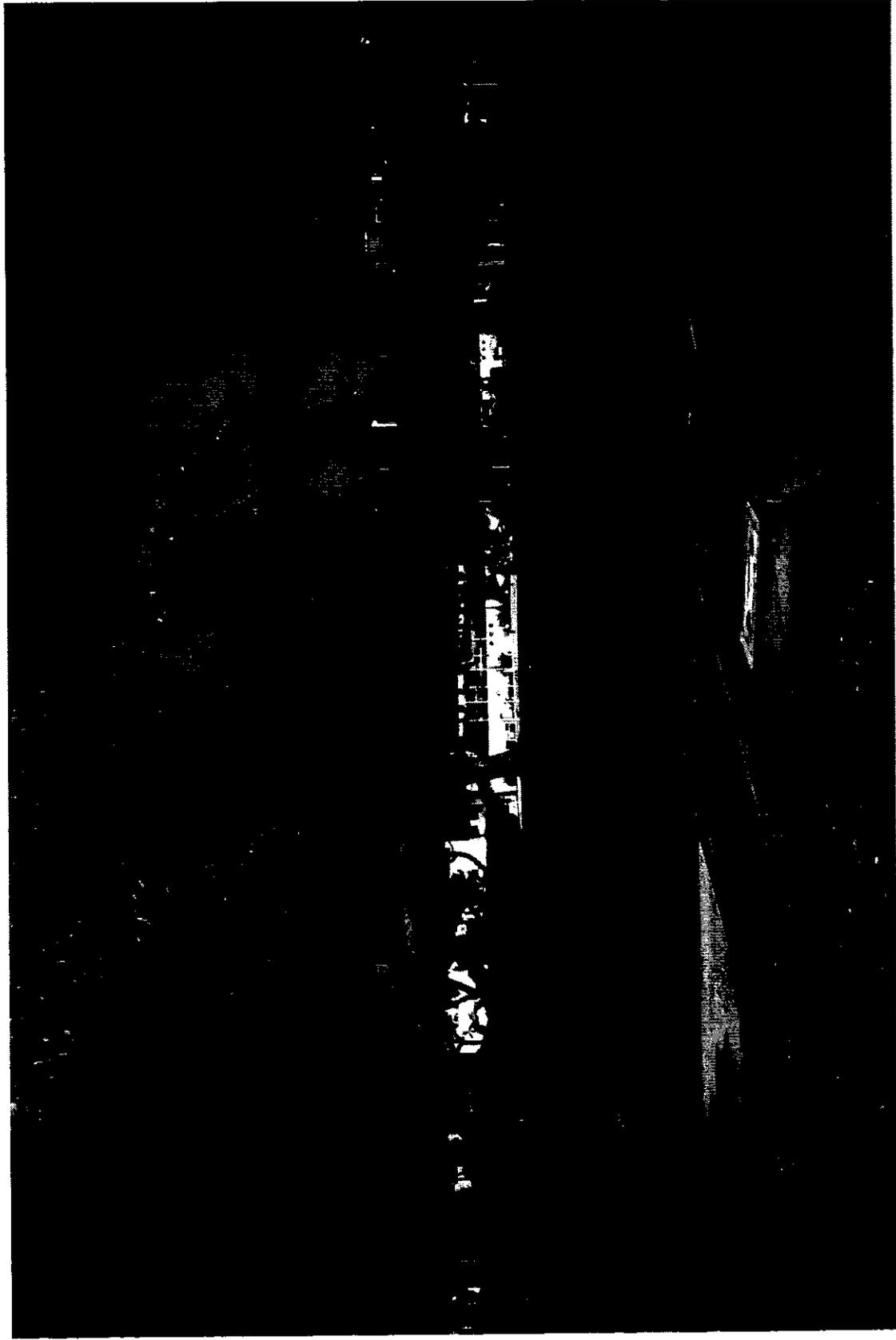

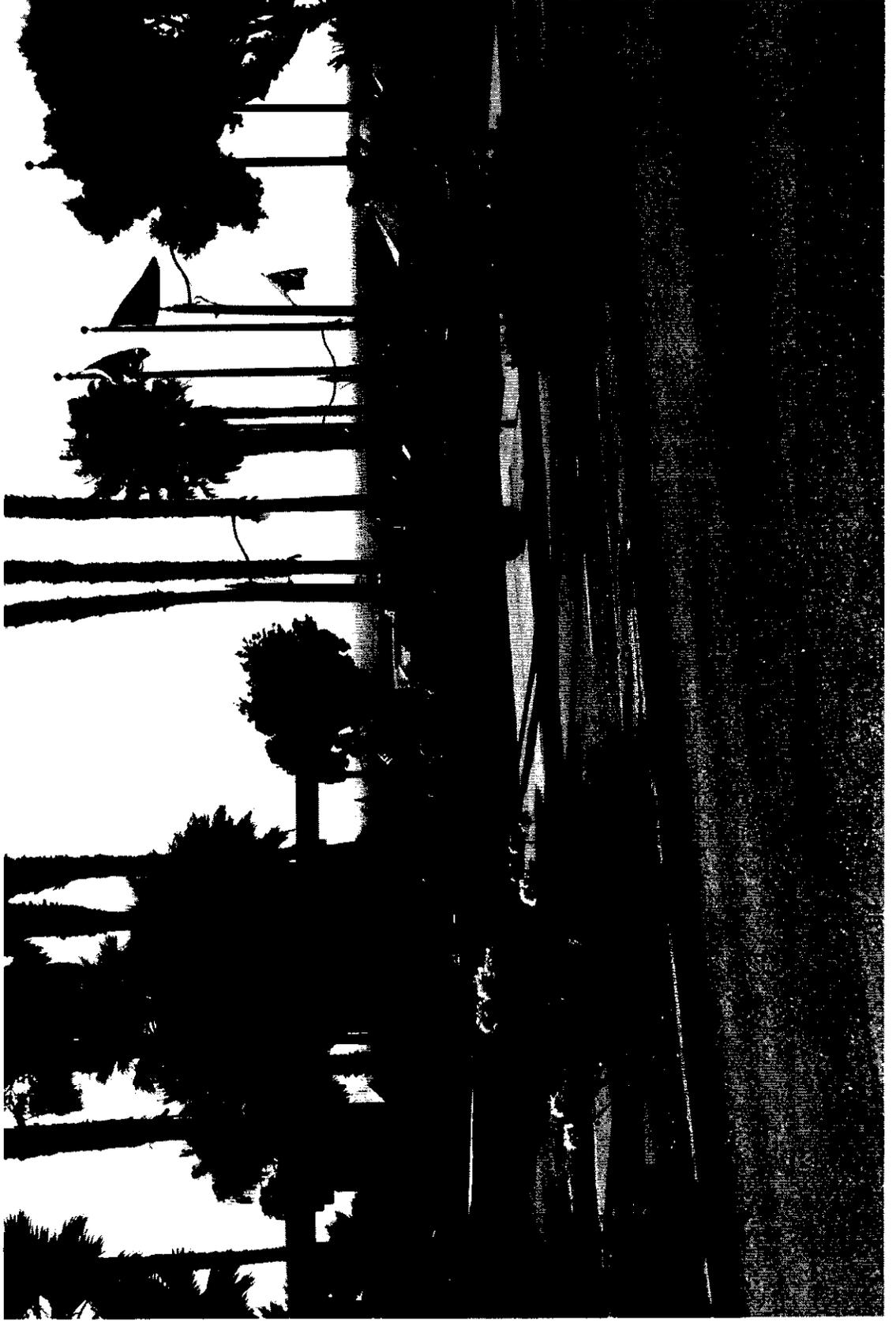

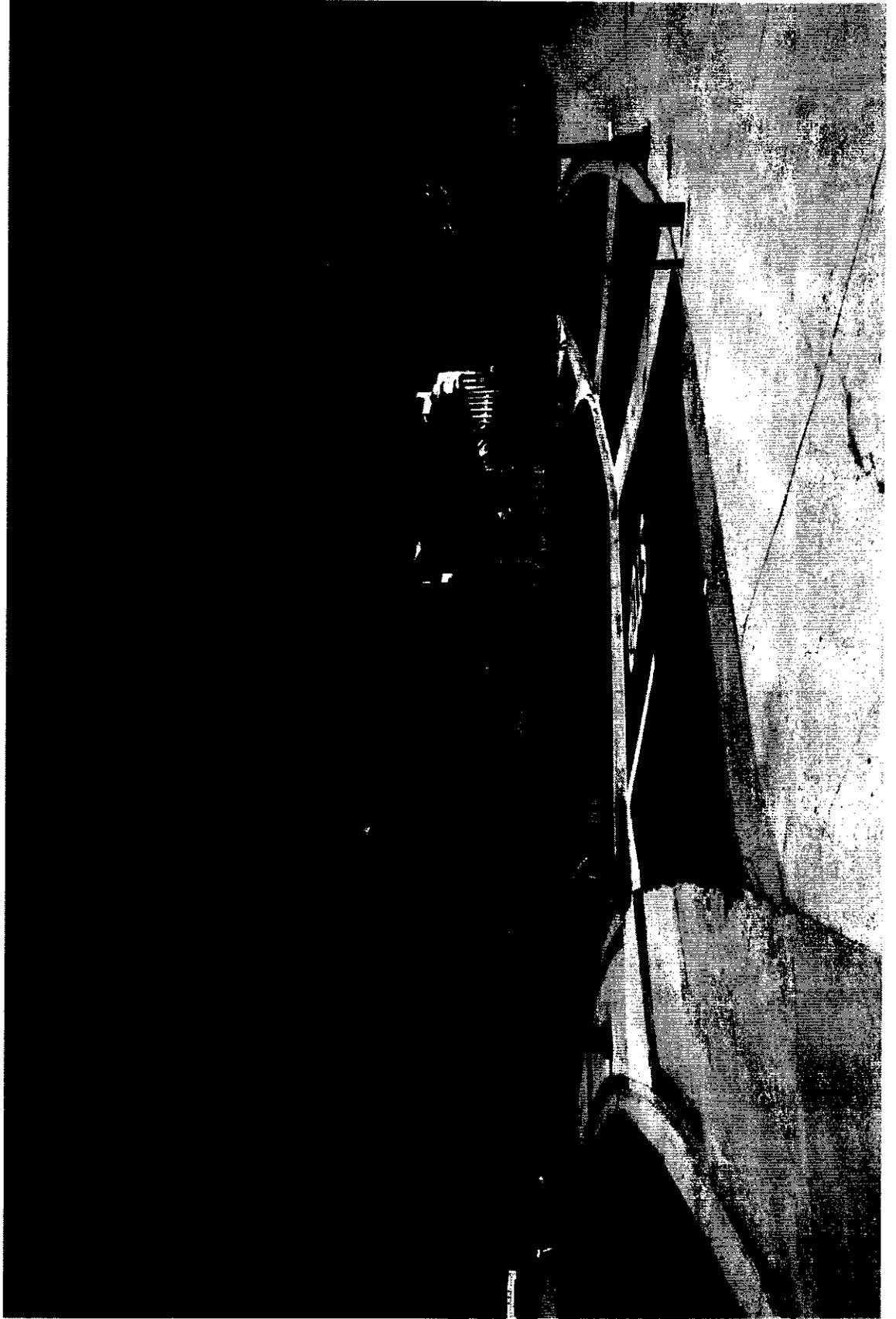
