SUBJECT: Monthly Statistical Report - May 2016

This report reflects the May Part I Crimes, including the Year-To-Date (YTD) totals. The overall citywide crime statistics show 95 fewer Part I crimes (12% decrease) when comparing this year to last year. When comparing May 2016 to May 2015 there were 7 more Part I crimes (5% increase).

NOTE: May's Part I Crime total of 164 is the highest since August 2015, when we had 164 total Part I Crimes. Also, burglaries have increased by 14% when comparing this year to last year; in April 2016 there were 26 burglaries whereas May 2016 had 47 burglaries, which is an 80% increase.

There were 170 burglaries reported this year: 75% were residential; 25% were commercial. Of the 435 larcenies reported this year, 148 were larceny from vehicle (34%). See Other Statistics of Interest table on page 3 for more information.

Beginning in January 2015, the Rape category statistics are calculated using the new FBI/UCR and CA Department of Justice definitions.

As in all statistical comparisons, caution should be exercised in interpreting percent changes. When smaller numbers are compared the result is a greater percentage change; in other words, a more dramatic result is achieved.
