9-20-16 1500 hours	500 blk. Fisherman's Wharf	On Tuesday, September 20, 2016, at approximately 1500 hours, officers responded to the Redondo Beach pier for a theft report. Two victims parked and locked their bicycles at a designated bike rack. When they returned about an hour later their bicycle locks had been cut and the bikes were missing.
9-21-16 1659 Hours	200 Blk. Of S. Broadway Ave.	On Wednesday, September 21, 2016, at approximately 1659 hours, communications received a call from a citizen reporting a subject walking in the area of 200 S. Broadway Ave. with what appeared to be a handgun in their waistband. The citizen lost a visual of the subject near a church that was hosting a feeding in the area as responding officers began to arrive on scene. A second citizen reported similar circumstances while at the same time the suspicious person in question called 9-1-1 from a cellular phone and maintained an open line for a short period of time during which police dispatchers could hear a subject rambling about killing police officers. Dispatch was able to provide an approximate location of the caller and with the help of the Hawthorne PD helicopter a containment and command post were established. Contact was made with church feeding coordinators and a search team was preparing for deployment when an officer observed a suspicious person in a vehicle that matched the suspect description parked near the church. Members of the directed enforcement unit responded and detained the occupant of the vehicle without incident who was positively identified as the suspicious subject by the initial reporting citizen. No weapon was located and the subject was committed for a mental health evaluation.
9-22-16 0147 hours	1600 block Spreckles Ln.	On Thursday, September 22, 2016 at approximately 0147 hours, Redondo Beach Police dispatch broadcast a radio call of a vehicle burglary in the 1600 block of Spreckles Lane. The victim's father observed a male suspect ransacking his daughter's vehicle. Suspect fled the location eastbound and out of sight. A responding officer noticed a vehicle leaving the area and advised other responding police units of its direction of travel. Officers located and conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle on Aviation Blvd, detaining the driver pending further investigation. A field-show-up was conducted where the subject detained was positively identified as the suspect. Suspect was arrested and booked at the Redondo Beach jail for the appropriate theft related charges.

09-24-16 2159 Hours	2600 Blk. Of Robinson St.	On Saturday, September 24, 2016, at approximately 2159 hours, officers were dispatched to a property in the 2600 Blk. of Robinson St. regarding a male and female that didn't live at the location who were both inside the laundry room. When officers arrived they recognized the subjects as the persons who were suspected in vehicle burglaries from the previous week. In the previous incident officers conducted a probation search at the male suspect's house and recovered property from two vehicle burglaries. When the suspects were contacted they were in possession of mail belonging to other people and bicycles. Officers responded to the locations where the mail was from and verified a theft of mail had occurred at the location. The subjects were arrested for the vehicle burglaries from last week, theft of mail and possession of stolen property.
09-25-16 1324 Hours	1900 Bk. Of Robinson St.	On Sunday, September 25, 2016, at approximately 1324 hours, a caller reported two subjects that entered a vacant residence located in the 1900 Blk. of Robinson St. Officers arrived on scene, and checked the location which was negative for any suspects. A vehicle in the garage was found to be recently stolen out of Redondo Beach and had license plates affixed that did not belong to the vehicle. There were several items of personal property found in and near the stolen vehicle, which one of the patrol officers matched to a local transient that he had stopped earlier in the day. A report was completed, the personal property was collected, and the vehicle was returned to the registered owner.
