SUBJECT: Monthly Statistical Report for AUGUST 2016

This report reflects August's Part I Crimes, including the Year-To-Date (YTD) totals. The overall citywide crime statistics show 80 less Part I crimes (6% decrease) when comparing this year to last year. When comparing August 2016 to August 2015 there were 19 more Part I crimes (12% increase) and when comparing August 2016 to July 2016 (last month) there's a 5% increase from July's total of 174 Part I Crimes.

NOTE: August's Part I Crime total of 183 is the highest total I can trace (as far back as Nov 2011). Also, burglaries have increased by 16% when comparing this year to last year. Furthermore, when comparing August 2016 to August 2015 burglaries have increased by 68% (15 more burglaries). Similarly, when comparing August 2016 to July 2016 (last month) there were 15 more burglaries in August (68% increase).

There have been 269 reported burglaries this year: 75% were residential; 25% were commercial. Of the 758 larcenies reported this year, 266 were larceny from vehicle1 (20%). See Other Statistics of Interest table on page 3 for more information.

Furthermore, when comparing this year to last year, statistics show a 27% decrease in robberies (12 fewer robberies) and a 23% increase in aggravated assault (13 more aggravated assaults) this year.

MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT**AUGUST 2016**

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Beginning in January 2015, the Rape category statistics are calculated using the new FBI/UCR and CA Department of Justice definitions.

As in all statistical comparisons, caution should be exercised in interpreting percent changes. When smaller numbers are compared the result is a greater percentage change; in other words, a more dramatic result is achieved.

BY COUNCIL DISTRICT

Council Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4 with the Galleria have shown a decrease in Part I crimes when comparing this year to last year (3%, 21%, 17%, & 8% respectively). On the other hand, Council District 4 WITHOUT the Galleria shows an increase as does Council District 5 (17% & 28 % respectively).
