SUBJECT: Monthly Statistical Report for SEPTEMBER 2016 & Quarterly Charts (July - Sept)

This report reflects September's Part I Crimes, including the Year-To-Date (YTD) totals. The overall citywide crime statistics show 87 less Part I crimes (6% decrease) when comparing this year to last year.

NOTE: Burglaries have increased by 21% when comparing this year to last year (52 more burglaries YTD). Furthermore, when comparing September 2016 to September 2015 burglaries have increased by 84% (16 more burglaries).

There have been 304 reported burglaries this year: 74% were residential; 26% were commercial. Of the 853 larcenies reported this year, 306 were larceny from vehicle (36%).

Furthermore, when comparing this year to last year, statistics show a 14% decrease in robberies (7 fewer robberies) and a 6% increase in aggravated assault (6 more aggravated assaults) this year.

**MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT****SEPTEMBER 2016**

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Beginning in January 2015, the Rape category statistics are calculated using the new FBI/UCR and CA Department of Justice definitions.

As in all statistical comparisons, caution should be exercised in interpreting percent changes. When smaller numbers are compared the result is a greater percentage change; in other words, a more dramatic result is achieved.

**BY COUNCIL DISTRICT**

Council Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4 with the Galleria have shown a decrease in Part I crimes when comparing this year to last year (2%, 18%, 21%, & 10% respectively). On the other hand, Council District 4 WITHOUT the Galleria showed an increase as did Council District 5 (16% & 31 % respectively).
